WHAT IS MY ROAD TO WEMBLEY?

My Road to Wembley (MRTW) is home of the "Road to Wembley" challenge and increases FA Cup attendances across the tournament.

The platform is an online directory of every team invited to the FA Cup showing its members, known as RoundHoppers, where their nearest games are, how to meet other members at the games and what type of match day extras they can buy.

Recognised by the FA, RoundHoppers push vital revenue through ticket and match day purchases helping keep football clubs stay in business across the lowest tiers of the game.

Bringing its members together via its social media outlets, MRTW incentivises RoundHoppers to complete the full fourteen rounds, known as Quattourdecim, by presenting them with their personalised t-shirts at the Final Party before the final itself.

WHY WAS IT CREATED?

In the wake of the pandemic and seeing the reaction of fans to the European Super League, we wanted to create something that both brought people together and pushed revenue towards parts of our game that needed it the most.

We knew that following the FA Cup is a challenge. With so many rounds (fourteen in total) and so many teams (c.730) entering and being knocked out at different stages of the tournament the pure logistics of knowing which team to follow and when is impossible.

My Road to Wembley's objective is to



build one million RoundHoppers which would create £100m of revenue for the FA Cup clubs before Premier League clubs even entered the tournament.

We see the potential of MRTW becoming a catalyst to rebuild communities up and down the country, returning the country to its nostalgic core values.

MATCH REWIND

FARNBOROUGH 1 HAYES & YEADING UNITED 1

17.09.2022 – EMIRATES FA CUP SECOND QUALIFYING ROUND

Hayes & Yeading returned from Farnborough on Saturday with a deserved Emirates FA Cup 1-1 draw, which means we do it all again here this evening.

The first chance early on came United's way when a free-kick was awarded some 25 yards from goal, Mo Bettamer stepped up and fired the ball past the defensive wall but 'Boro stopper Jack Turner got well behind the shot although he did have to be quick to gather after spilling the initial effort.

Six minutes later the host National League South side took the lead with their first real attack of the game when Reggie Young burst away on the right flank, the dangerous winger swept past Luke Brophy and fired across Jacob Adams into the far corner.

Buoyed by going ahead the home side pushed for a quick second with a long range Freddie Grant effort being comfortably held by Adams who soon after denied Liam Ferdinand who was sent through after the home side broke quickly from back to front.

A superlative United move on 26 minutes brought an equaliser. Charlie Wassmer played the ball forwards to Bettamer, his knock down found Moses Emmanuel who played an exquisite pass just beyond the defenders outstretched boot to Taylor Miles who showed great composure to slot the ball beyond Jack Turner in the hosts goal.

Four minutes later Dan Wishart, playing in an unaccustomed right midfield slot, collected the ball 25 yards out before cutting inside the area and getting off a shot that was just too high.

Two half chances for the home side came forth in the closing few minutes of the half. Hisham Kasimu collected a long punt forwards and played the ball square to Michael Fernandes but his effort was easily dealt with by Adams, as was a 20 yard free-kick from former United man Omar Rowe which despite beating the wall only provided a simple



catch for the United custodian and the half closed all square at 1-1.

Half-time saw a change for United with debutant Adam Liddle coming into the fray in Wishart's place and just three minutes from the restart Alfie Williams fired a free-kick in from the left side that Turner fumbled under pressure with his defence scrambling the ball clear to save his blushes.

On the hour mark a right side breakaway by the home side saw Paul Field slip as Fernandes moved past him into the United area, his angled drive was parried away by Adams who quickly dropped onto the loose ball.

Four minutes later Adams had to be at his best when a corner from the right was only cleared as far as Rowe, his angled drive forcing an excellent save from the United stopper.

A further brace of half chances came and went for the hosts as we moved

through the final twenty minutes. Another corner from the right came in, this time it found the head of Jack Ball but he headed wide of the target before substitute Mekhi Leacock-McLeod broke free on the right only to pull the ball across the United area to an area absent of any of his teammates.

With seven minutes to play Emmanuel collected a flick on just outside the 'Boro box, his neat touch and turn took him away from his marker but just as he got his shot away Freddie Grant flew in with a superbly timed block and Turner was not worried.

The only other real chance came with literally the final kick of the game as Adams got the slightest fingertip to a drive that may or may not have been on target but as the ball flew over the crossbar referee Parkinson blew for time and we go again tonight.

50 YEARS AGO, IN THE 1972-73 SEASON, HAYES STARTED THEIR SECOND FA CUP CAMPAIGN AS MEMBERS OF THE ISTHMIAN LEAGUE.

However, Hayes supporters wouldn't have been wildly optimistic about progressing in the FA Cup as the club hadn't made it to the first round proper for eight years.

Curiously, Hayes began on the road to Wembley at Wembley, having been drawn against the Athenian Premier League side in the FA Cup Preliminary Round. On Saturday 2nd September a 2-1 win allowed Hayes to progress.

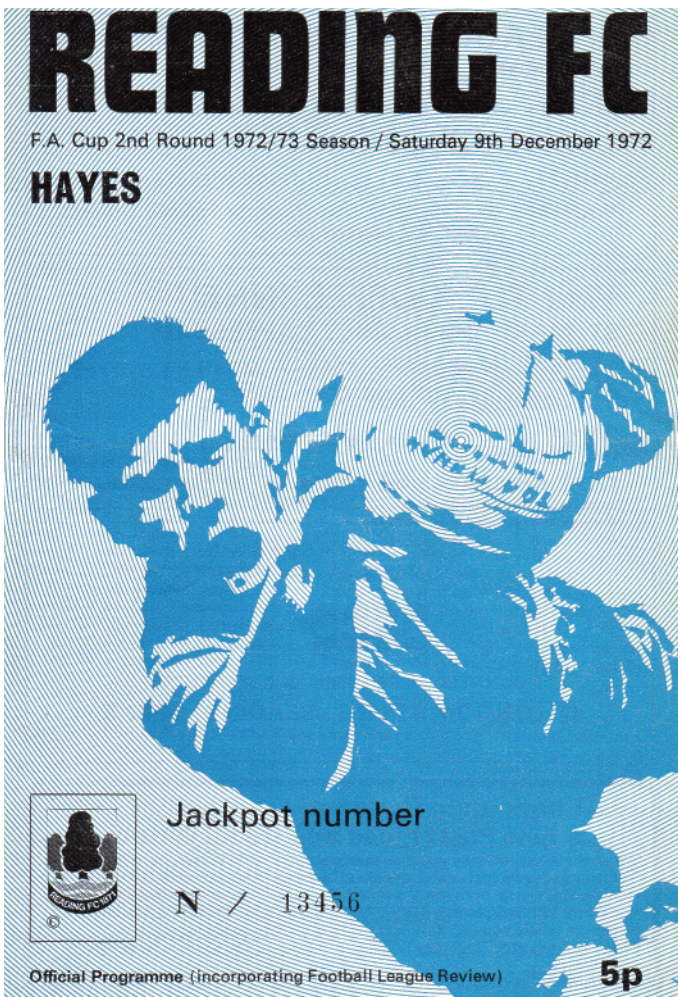
In the first qualifying round on Saturday 16th September, Hayes were drawn at home to Hoddesdon Town. A score of Hayes 4 Hoddesdon Town 1 suggests that the opposition wouldn't have enjoyed their trip down the A10. However, this was a very successful time for Hoddesdon Town as they would be Spartan League runners-up in 1972-73 and would win the inaugural FA Vase the following season.

On Saturday 7th October, in the second qualifying round, Hayes travelled to the London Borough of Bexley to play Athenian Premier side, Erith & Belvedere. The game was played at Park View, which may make you think that it was played at Welling United. However, these neighbours had grounds with similar names. In fact, in 1972 it was Bexley United who played at Park View Road, and when they folded in 1976, Welling United moved in a year later. To confuse things further, when Erith & Belvedere's Park View grandstand was destroyed by fire in 1999, they moved from Park View to Park View Road. They remain ground sharing today.

A score of Erith & Belvedere 1 Hayes 2, allowed Hayes to progress once again. They were given a further boost when, against all received medical opinion, talismanic Robin Friday revealed he was fit to play in the next round.

On Saturday 21st October Hayes played semi-professional Wealdstone of Southern League Division One South in the third qualifying round. Robin Friday grabbed a goal on his return, and a score of Hayes 3 Wealdstone 1 allowed the Missioners to progress once again.

On Saturday 4th November Hayes

travelled to Barking for the fourth qualifying round. The omens were good, as it was a repeat of the 1923 tie when Hayes first qualified to meet Football League opposition in the FA Cup. Hayes duly prevailed, beating Barking 2-1.

Hayes were rewarded with an FA Cup first round proper home tie against Bristol Rovers, who would be the first Football League club to visit Church

Road for an official match. Bristol Rovers, then of Division Three (now known as League One), had just beaten Manchester United (who would finish 18th of 22 teams in Division One that season) in the League Cup and would be tough opponents.

On Saturday 18th November 1972, less than a year after the English section of the M4 was completed, Bristol Rovers

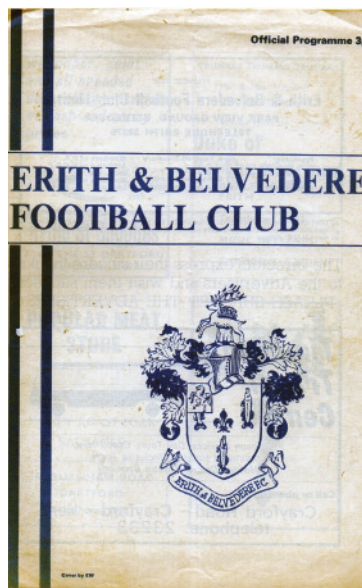
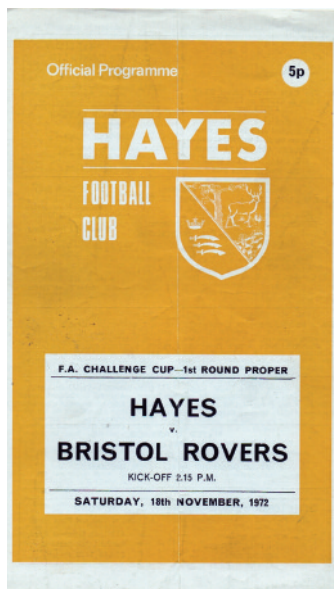

travelled 100 miles east where a Church Road crowd estimated at 6,000 witnessed an excellent Hayes performance and a goal from Bobby Hatt to give Hayes a deserved 1-0 victory.

On Saturday 9th December, in the second-round proper, Hayes travelled west along the M4 to Elm Park, home of promotion-chasing Reading of Division Four (now known as League Two). A crowd of 9,545 witnessed a goalless draw largely thanks to Man-of-the-Match Ian Bath, the Hayes goalkeeper.

On Tuesday 12th December a crowd of 7,341 turned up at Church Road for the replay. Hayes spent most of the match on top, but a final score of Hayes 0 Reading 1 meant their dream of reaching the third-round proper for the first time was over. However, for Robin Friday the dream was only just beginning as he would join Reading in January 1974.

Having secured promotion into the Vanarama National League South via the play-offs at the expense of ourselves at the end of last season, life at the higher level has started with two wins and five defeats from their opening eight League games.

The season got underway at Hemel Hempstead Town and resulted in a narrowly 1-0 reverse. They were able to secure their first point of the campaign in their first game on home soil against Dulwich Hamlet as Tony Lee's first half penalty was cancelled out by a last minute spot-kick at the other end.

That first win duly came in the next game a few days later when Omar Rowe's strike gave them a hard-earned victory over Taunton Town and their first taste of victory at this level since 2015.

The month of August ended with three successive defeats as firstly they went down 4-2 at Ebbsfleet United before succumbing to a 1-0 home reverse at the hands of Bath City. More misery was added when Havant & Waterlooville triumphed by the same scoreline in their next outing.

A second win of the campaign saw September start on a positive note as Liam Ferdinand's goal on the hour proved to be the difference at fellow new-boys, Cheshunt. Their last League

encounter ended in a 2-1 defeat at Tonbridge Angels as Hisham Kasimu's last gasp goal proved to be too little, too late.

We welcome everyone connected to our opponents before wishing them a safe journey home afterwards.

POLICE also didn't have things all their own way against Burgess Hill Town, but they eventually prevailed 3-1.

Despite going a goal down, HANWELL TOWN managed to come back to win 2-1 at Cray Valley PM. Kwaku Lucan and Shomari Barnwell got the goals.

Meanwhile HENDON chalked up a 3-1 success against Wingate & Finchley.

There was a close encounter at YATE TOWN edged past TIVERTON TOWN by two goals to one courtesy of a late strike from Khari Allen and it was

similarly tight as SWINDON SUPERMARINE beat DORCHESTER TOWN thanks to a goal from Henry Spalding.
